Remarkable personalities - Commemorative Medals of Prince Albert I:

- **1950 - Pr. Paul PORTIER** (France): discovered anaphylaxis with Charles Richet.
- **1973 - Pr. Maurice FONTAINE** (France): marine biologist and physiologist. He conducts

research on the biology of certain aquatic species (sea lamprey, eel, salmon in particular), specifically works on: endocrinology, hibernation, migratory behavior. Created the term «marine molysmology" to describe a new science: the study of marine pollution from human activities.

- **1977 - Pr. Henri LACOMBE** (France): In 1948, Henri Lacombe created the first School of oceanographic education in France. He discovered the fundamental mechanism of formation of deep water in the oceans (in the Mediterranean).
- **1979 - Pr. Jean-Marie PÉRÈS** (France): precursor of benthic bionomics of the Mediterranean Sea. Published a global synthesis of marine benthic ecology. His numerous cruises and dives in various regions of the world gave him a broad overview of benthic marine ecology. He was a remarkable teacher, a defender of French oceanographic research and international scientific advisor for many emerging countries.
- **1981 - Cdt Jacques -Yves COUSTEAU** (France).
- **1987 - Pr. Xavier LE PICHON** (France): French geo-dynamicien, he became famous for having proposed the first model of plate tectonics in 1968
