Ambien is a sedative medication (also known as a hypnotic) that is also available under the generic name of zolpidem. Ambien helps treat insomnia by affecting chemicals in the brain that may not balance in people with sleep problems like insomnia (a sleeping disorder).

The immediate-release form of this drug helps you fall asleep when you go to bed. First Ambien CR (extended-release) tablets have two layers, the first one dissolves quickly to help you fall asleep, and the second one dissolves slowly to help you stay asleep.

Important Information about Ambien

- Ambien may cause allergic reactions. Stop using it and take medical help if you have signs of an allergic reaction, including trouble breathing, hives, or swelling of your face, throat, lips, or tongue.
- Do not share Ambien with someone else, even if they have similar symptoms. Doctors prescribe different doses for men and women, and this drug is not under the recommendation for use by children. Misuse of Ambien can result in dangerous side effects.

- Ambien may impair your reactions along with your thinking. You may feel sleepy the morning after taking Ambien, especially if you are a woman or take the extended-release form of this medicine.
- Never take Ambien in smaller or larger amounts or for longer than recommended. Do not take it after drinking alcohol during the day or just before bed.

What to know before taking Ambien?

Some people taking Ambien were doing activities such as eating, driving, walking, having sex, making phone calls, and later having no memory of acting. If this happens to you, stop taking it and ask your doctor for another **sleep disorder treatment**. You should avoid taking Ambien if you are allergic to it.

This medicine may contain lactose, and you should use caution if you are allergic to lactose. Ambien is not under the recommendation for use by anyone younger than 18 years old. To ensure Ambien is safe for use, tell your medical healthcare provider if you have ever had:

- Liver or kidney disease;
- Interrupted breathing during sleep;
- Drug or alcohol addiction;
- Breathing problems or lung disease; or
- Mental illness, depression, or suicidal thoughts

Taking Ambien in the final trimester of pregnancy may cause drowsiness or breathing problems in your newborn baby. It may get unsafe to breastfeed while taking this medicine.

How to take Ambien?

Ambien is the most commonly prescribed sleep aid. Find out how to take Ambien safely with our directions and tips. This is a detailed beginner's guide to using and taking Ambien.

- Take Ambien precisely as per the doctor's recommendation. Read carefully and follow all the directions on the prescription label.

- Doctors prescribe different doses for men and women, and this drug is not under the recommendation for use by children. Misuse of Ambien can result in dangerous side effects.
- Ambien may be a habit-forming drug, and its misuse can cause overdose, addiction, or death. Do not share Ambien with someone else, even if they have similar symptoms. Never take any sleep-related drugs like Ambien if you do not have a complete sleep of seven to eight hours before being active again.
- Ambien is for short-period use only. Tell your medical healthcare professional if there is no improvement in your insomnia symptoms or if your condition worsens after taking it for 7 to 10 nights in a row. Do not take Ambien for more than 4 or 5 weeks without prior medical consultation.
- Do not suddenly stop taking Ambien after prolonged use, or you could face unpleasant withdrawal symptoms. Ask your doctor how to stop taking this medicine to avoid withdrawal symptoms.
- Swallow the whole Ambien CR tablet rather than crushing, chewing, or breaking it. Store Ambien away from heat and moisture at room temperature without freezing it.

Ambien dosage

Usual Ambien adult dosage for men

- Initial dose- 5 mg or 10 mg once per night immediately before bedtime.
- Maximum amount- 10 mg once per night.

Usual Ambien adult dosage for women

- Initial dose- 5 mg once per night immediately before bedtime.
- Maximum amount- 10 mg once per night.

Ambien Overdose

- In case of an overdose on Ambien, take medical help or call the Poison helpline at 1-800-222-1222. An overdose of Ambien can be deadly, especially when you take it with other medications that can cause drowsiness.
- Overdose symptoms may include confusion, sleepiness, feeling lightheaded, slow breathing, fainting, or coma.

What to avoid while using Ambien?

- Avoid Ambien while traveling, such as to sleep on a journey. You may awaken before the effects of this drug have worn off. Amnesia (a medical condition of forgetfulness) is more common if you do not sleep for seven to eight hours after taking Ambien.
- Do not take it after drinking alcohol during the day or just before bed. Avoid driving or performing any hazardous activity until you know the effect of this medicine on you. You may feel sleepy the morning after taking Ambien.

Ambien side effects

Ambien may lead to severe allergic reactions. Take instant medical help if you have signs of an allergic reaction to Ambien that may include hives, trouble breathing, or swelling in your face, lips, throat, or tongue. Stop taking medicine and promptly call the doctor if you have:

- Trouble swallowing or breathing
- Rapid or irregular heartbeat, chest pain, feeling short of breath
- Feeling like you might pass out

Common side effects of Ambien may include:

- Loss of coordination, tired feeling
- Daytime drowsiness, weakness, dizziness, feeling lightheaded
- Nausea, diarrhea, constipation, upset stomach
- Dry mouth, stuffy nose, nose or throat irritation
- Headache, muscle pain

It is not a complete list of side effects, and others may occur. Take your doctor's medical help regarding side effects.

What drugs can interact with Ambien?

- Taking Ambien with other drugs that cause drowsiness can worsen this effect. Consult your medical healthcare professional before using a muscle relaxer, sleeping pill, opioid medication, or any treatment for anxiety or seizures (convulsions).
- Various drugs may interact with Ambien, increasing its side effects or making it less effective. It includes prescription and over-the-counter (OTC) medicines, herbal products, and vitamins.

Restoril vs. Ambien

While both Ambien and Restoril treat insomnia, they are not the same. Restoril is a benzodiazepine that affects muscle relaxation, convulsions, and anxiety. Ambien is not a benzodiazepine and has a more specific receptor target, and avoids these effects while targeting insomnia.

The standard dosage of Restoril is 30mg at bedtime, while the usual dosage of Ambien is 10mg at bedtime. While both Restoril and Ambien can improve sleep efficiency, Ambien is significantly better at reducing the number of awakenings after falling asleep. Given this and the more specific activities toward sleep, you may prefer Ambien over Restoril.

Ambien is superior in reducing the number of awakenings after sleep onset. In other words, patients are less likely to wake up through the night with Ambien than with Restoril. Given this information, and considering that Ambien avoids undesired effects on seizure activity and muscle relaxation, the prescriber can choose Ambien for your short-term insomnia.

Restoril is commonly used in treating short-term insomnia. Short-term insomnia typically lasts a few days or weeks and is generally related to a change in sleep schedule or a particular stressor.

In its immediate-release form, Ambien is used in short-term insomnia characterized by difficulty falling asleep or initiating sleep. Ambien CR, the extended-release formulation, treats insomnia characterized by trouble initiating and maintaining sleep or staying asleep.

FAQs (frequently asked questions)

Q1. Can you snort Ambien?

Snorting Ambien lets zolpidem get into your bloodstream rapidly through the nasal tissues. This is hazardous because the drug is absorbed in higher amounts than would typically enter the bloodstream all at once. A large dose of Ambien can result in an overdose, resulting in slowed breathing, low blood pressure, and potential death. Even when a person does not overdose, snorting raises the risk of severe side effects.

Snorting Ambien to get high will cause potential problems for a person physically. Please read further to know what happens when Ambien goes into the system and when you snort the drug. Ambien works by slowing the brain down, leading to drowsiness. It will have psychoactive effects if taken other than prescribed.

Possible psychoactive effects of snorting Ambien include hallucinations, but it can also cause trouble concentrating, focusing, and coordination. Even when taken as prescribed, Ambien can cause memory loss if you take it without a total of seven to eight hours of sleep.

Ambien tablets are specifically designed to be taken orally. Snorting Ambien has been associated with reports of severe drug reactions. Ambien tablets contain filler particulates which can be dangerous if you snort them and can cause inflammation of the nasal lining and blockages or infections in the nasal airways, lungs, and respiratory tracts.

Q2. Can you take Ambien and melatonin together?

Using zolpidem and melatonin can increase side effects such as confusion, dizziness, drowsiness, and difficulty concentrating. Some people, especially the elderly, can also experience impairment in thinking, judgment, and motor coordination. Combining melatonin with low-dose Ambien may promote daytime sleep without exacerbating performance impairments seen with high-dose zolpidem alone.

Q3. Does Ambien cause tinnitus?

Zolpidem (Ambien) can cause tinnitus when you take it. However, if you quit Ambien “cold turkey” after you have formed a dependence on this drug, you leave yourself open to severe tinnitus occurring after you stop taking this drug. This is one of the reasons you must never quit Ambien “cold turkey” after you have built up a dependence.

Q4. Can you take Ambien and Tramadol together?

It would be best if you did not mix Tramadol with Ambien unless no other treatment options are effective. In these cases, the prescribing physician must closely monitor Tramadol and Ambien. Combining an opioid (such as Tramadol) with a CNS depressant (such as Ambien) can result in serious side effects, including lightheadedness, low blood pressure (hypotension), intense sleepiness, dizziness, unresponsiveness, and slow and ineffective breathing (hypoventilation, respiratory depression).

Q5. Can you take Benadryl with Ambien?

Benadryl is a sedating antihistamine commonly used to treat allergic reactions, seasonal allergies, symptoms associated with the common cold, and insomnia. Both the drugs, i.e., Benadryl and Ambien, depress the central nervous system, and there have been reports of respiratory depression during the combination.

This could lead to labored and shallow breathing, which can be extremely dangerous, especially in some individuals taking other CNS depressants such as opioids. Using Benadryl with Ambien can increase side effects such as drowsiness, confusion, dizziness, and difficulty concentrating. Some individuals, especially the elderly, can also experience impaired judgment, thinking, and motor coordination.
